



## Application for The Appalachian At-Promise Scholarship

**Program Goals:** The GACHE Appalachian At-Promise Scholarship program is designed to benefit graduates of a GACHE funded high school (listed below) who wish to pursue post-secondary education. This program recognizes promising students, provides needed financial support, and assists students in achieving their education, training and career goals.

**Guidelines:** GACHE's partner post-secondary institutions offer scholarships to a select number of graduates for educational expenses associated with attendance at the institution granting the scholarship. The number of awards given is dependent on available pledges and the number of applications received at the GACHE office by the deadline of **March 30<sup>th</sup>**.

Students applying for an Appalachian At-Promise Scholarship will submit the application and supporting documents to their GACHE Grant Coordinator in their high school by the deadline of **March 1<sup>st</sup>**:

A two page essay addressing (a) what I have done to prepare for my future career and a justification of financial need along with educational plans, career goals, extracurricular activities and employment during high school (if any) and high school transcript. Students are encouraged to include additional information regarding number of family members in the home, and other pertinent financial and/or family circumstances.

The GACHE Grant Coordinator for the high school will submit the completed application package, consisting of the following components, to the GACHE office by the deadline of **March 30<sup>th</sup>** of each school year.

- High school transcript
- GPA
- Class standing and number of students in graduating class
- ACT/SAT scores (if available)
- Number of absences during previous semester
- Names of institutions applied to and whether or not accepted.

The Appalachian At-Promise Scholarship is intended to support first year college students and must be used the year the scholarship is awarded.

**Selection Criteria:** GACHE will evaluate applications and notify the school and sponsoring institutions of award recipients. ## **CHECKLIST**

- 1. A completed Appalachian At-Promise Scholarship Application package with full legal name, address, and phone number that provides:**
  - a. The name of your high school**
  - b. ACT/SAT scores (if taken)**
  - c. Grade Point Average (GPA)**
  - d. High school graduation data**
  - e. Your class standing as of fall semester**
  - f. The number of students in your graduation class**
  - g. Name of college, technical college, or university you plan to attend and whether or not you have been accepted**
  - h. The source and amount of other financial aid or scholarship assistance requested and/or received**
  - i. The two page essay described above**
  - j. An official copy of your high school transcript.**
  - k. If the high school transcript does not show the number of absences during your last semester, provide a separate letter signed from your guidance office providing the number of absences during the last semester**
  
- 2. Submit this completed package to your GACHE grant coordinator on or before the deadline of March 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. The Grant Coordinator will submit one application per institution by March 30<sup>th</sup> for consideration by the GACHE staff.**
  
- 3. The high school grant coordinator and student will be notified by April 20<sup>th</sup> of selection.**
